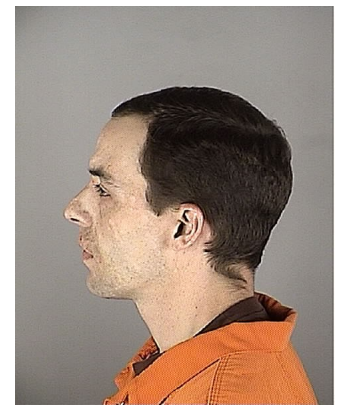

School Activity Reports

High School Liaison

For the month of December, **Detective Kara Christensen** reports 145 incidents, resulting in four reports and five citations or referrals to the County Attorney.

December was a quiet month at the high school, with the biggest attention garnered by a deer carcass that had been placed at the school. No crime was com-

mitted, but Det. Christensen took the opportunity to speak with several students about making good decisions involving social media use.

Middle School Liaison

Also in December, **Detective Brittany Carstensen** reports 141 incidents, resulting in eight reports and five referrals to the County Attorney.

Det. Carstensen investigated a report of a student in possession of a knife. The student stated he brought it for “protection”. He was subject to school discipline and the report was forwarded to the County Attorney’s Office.

Both detectives also report five responses to other school facilities for the month.

Search Warrant Arrest

On Thursday, January 7th, agents of the **Cannon River Drug and Violent Offender Task Force** carried out a search warrant at a Faribault residence. The search warrant was part of a methamphetamine sales investigation. The agents were assisted by **Detective Brittany Carstensen** and **Officers Chris Tonjum**. Inside the residence, agents found about 13 grams of methamphet-



amine, packaging and a scale, and several items of drug paraphernalia. The suspect, Tracy Neudecker, 41, was arrested and jailed without incident. He was charged with 1st degree Controlled Substances (Sales) and 2nd degree Controlled Substances (Possession). His bail was set at \$200,000 without conditions.
