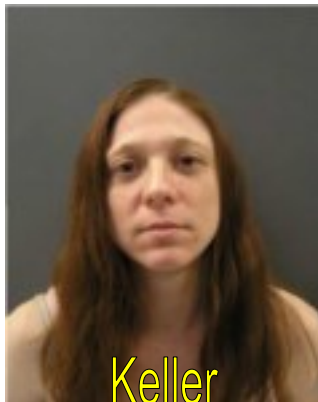

Search Warrant Arrests

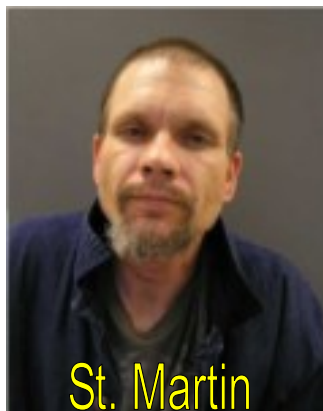
On Monday, April 18th, agents of the **Cannon River Drug and Violent Offender Task Force** carried out a search warrant at a Faribault residence. The agents were assisted by **Sergeant Brandon Gliem, Detective Matt Kolling, Officer Josh Sjodin, RCSI Investigator Nate Hanson and Deputy Steve Bauer**. The encountered four persons at the residence. One of the suspects, Kendra Hausen, 33, was found with methamphetamine in her pants pocket. A second suspect, Andy Hiebert, 39, was found to be the subject of a Department of Corrections arrest warrant. A search of his vehicle turned up methamphetamine, a glass pipe used to smoke methamphetamine and a replica handgun. Inside the home, agents found three grams of methamphetamine and a meth pipe in a bedroom belonging to Deanna Keller, 30, and Trevor St. Martin, 37. All four were arrested without incident and jailed. Hausen was charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances, and was released on her own recognizance. Hiebert was charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances and Possession of a Firearm, and his bail was set at \$25,000 with conditions. Keller was charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances and Child Endangerment, and she was released on her own recognizance. St. Martin was charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances, and his bail was set at \$5,000 with conditions.

Suspicious Package Checked Out

On Tuesday, April 19th, officers **Josh Sjodin, Tony Kuchinka, Karl Willers** and **Sergeant Matt Knutson** responded to a suspicious package outside of the Rice County Government Services Building. **Detectives Matt Kolling, Scott Duncan, Captain Neal Pederson, Sheriff Troy Dunn, Chief Deputy Jesse Thomas, Lieutenant Joe Yetzer, Deputy Corey Warmington** and **Trooper Don Cobban** also responded to assist. The box displayed names and nonsensical writing.

The Bloomington Bomb Squad was contacted and responded to evaluate the package. The building was evacuated and the area was cordoned off. Meanwhile, **Sergeant Brandon Gliem, RCSI Sergeant Nate Budin** and **Investigator Paul LaRoche** interviewed a woman who had left a package outside of the LEC a few days earlier. The woman admitted to leaving the box and stated it only contained papers she intended for Social Services. She denied any intent to harm or scare people. An X

-ray of the box by the bomb squad confirmed it was harmless. The area was reopened.



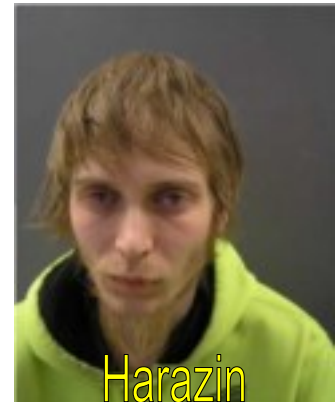

Drug Sales Arrest

On Wednesday, April 6th, agents of the **Cannon River Drug and Violent Offender Task Force** executed a search warrant at a Faribault residence. The agents were assisted by **Detectives Scott Duncan** and **Matt Kolling, Sergeants Brandon Gliem** and **Eric Sammon, Officer Justin Hunt** and **RCSI Investigator Paul LaRoche**. The officers encountered Noah Harazin, 28, and searched him. He was found to be in possession of over 14 grams of methamphetamine and a BB gun replica of a Sig Sauer pistol. Harazin was also discovered to be the subject of a Blue Earth County arrest warrant. He was jailed and charged with 1st degree Controlled Substances and 2nd degree Controlled

Substances. His bail was set at \$250,000 with conditions. The case highlights the increasing frequency in which officers are encountering replica handguns on the street. Very difficult to distinguish from an actual firearm, the replicas are used to threaten and intimidate others, and can put officers in a position where they may need to use deadly force.
