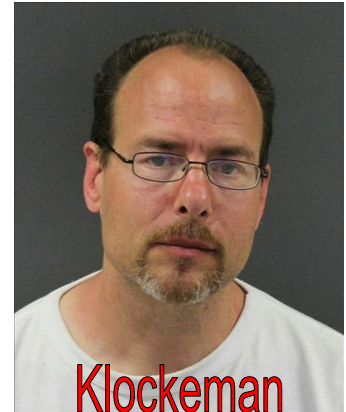

## Inmate Recaptured

On Saturday, July 2nd, MCF-Faribault officials reported an escaped offender. The suspect, Christian Klockeman, 54, was assigned to the minimum security unit and cut off his ankle bracelet before absconding. A search of the area did not turn him up. At 6:24pm, an alert citizen called to report encountering Klockeman in downtown Faribault, where the suspect was asking people for cigarettes. **Officers John Pesta and Said**

**Hilowle** responded and found Klockeman, who gave the officers a phony name. They verified his true identity and arrested him. In an interview, he admitted to **Detective Kara Christensen** fleeing the prison, and that he tried to leave town but did not have any money. He was jailed and charged with Escape from Prison, and returned to MCF-Faribault.

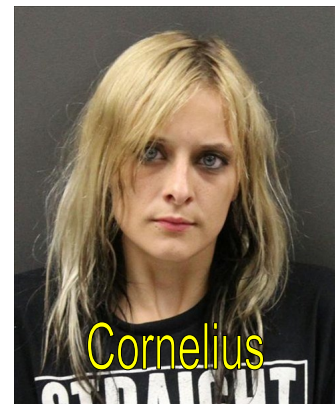

## Narcotics Arrest

On Friday, July 1st, **Officers Adam Marvin, Ben Johns and DJ Skluzacek** responded to a report of a person “shooting up” (using a hypodermic needle to ingest narcotics) outside of an apartment complex. Ofc. Marvin found a young female in the area matching the caller’s description. When he attempted to speak with her she tried to get away from him. While talking to her, Ofc. Marvin observed numerous

behaviors indicating she was under the influence of narcotics. In her backpack the officers found a glass pipe with burnt residue, which tested positive for methamphetamine. The suspect, identified as Taylor Cornelius, 19, was arrested and jailed. She was charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances and released on her own recognizance.



## Domestic Assault Arrest

On Wednesday, July 6th, **Officer Adam Marvin** met with a woman reporting a domestic assault. The victim stated her boyfriend had come to her workplace and threatened her. She stated he cut her with a utility knife and had their babysitter bring their child to the workplace. The suspect left with the infant and told the victim that she “may never see her child again” before leaving. The victim further reported a pattern of increasing violence and she was afraid for her life.



Ofc. Marvin located the suspect at his residence, but he refused to answer the door. **Sergeant Matt Long and Officer Karl Willers** arrived to assist. The victim gave the officers access to the residence, where they encountered the suspect, Brandon Doby, 31. He was arrested without incident and jailed. He was charged with 2nd degree Assault, Threats of Violence and Domestic Assault (felony). His bail was set at \$75,000 with conditions
