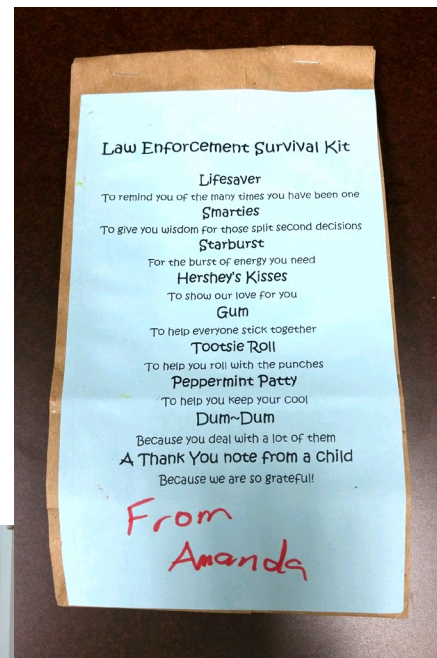

### Assault & Threats

On Saturday, July 9th, **Officers Karl Willers and John Pesta** were dispatched to an assault call. The caller stated her son had indicated he had a gun and threatened to kill her. The caller's husband told Ofc. Willers the suspect, Kiefer Gilfoy, 21, approached him carrying a kitchen knife, stood over him and threatened to kill him. Gilfoy fled the residence prior to the officers' arrival. A short time later, Ofc. Willers saw

the suspect walking, stopped and arrested him. Gilfoy was charged with 2nd degree Assault, Terroristic Threats and Domestic Abuse (two counts). His bail was set at \$5,000 with conditions.

### Domestic Assault Arrest

On Saturday, July 9th, **Officers Justin Hunt, Chris Tonjum and John Pesta** were dispatched to a reported domestic assault. The caller reported to dispatch that his adult daughter was chasing him with a knife. On arrival at the residence, the officers could hear yelling inside, and had to forcibly open the door. They saw the suspect holding a knife, and after several commands to drop the knife, the officers attempted to Tase r the suspect. The suspect continued to evade the officers and



eventually dropped the knife. The officers used a Taser a second time and subdued the suspect without injury to themselves or the suspect. The officers found the victim had been locked in a bedroom and the suspect had stabbed the door numerous times and threatening to kill the victim. After seeking medical attention, the suspect, Andrea Murray, 38, was jailed and charged with 2nd degree Assault and domestic Assault. Her bail was set at \$8,000 with conditions.
