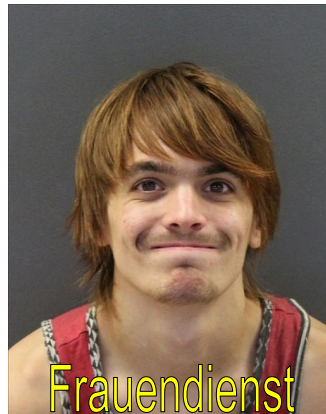

Walk in the Park

On Sunday, September 4th, officers were dispatched to Central Park for a disturbance, and **Officers Mallory House, Said Hilowle, Greta Luiken, Keith Voegel** and **RCSO Deputy Steve Bauer** responded. 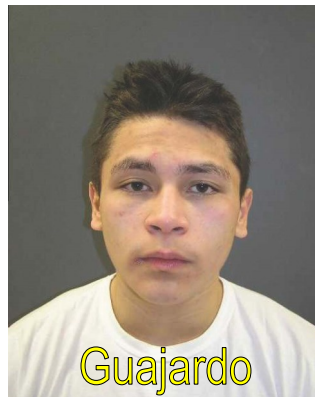
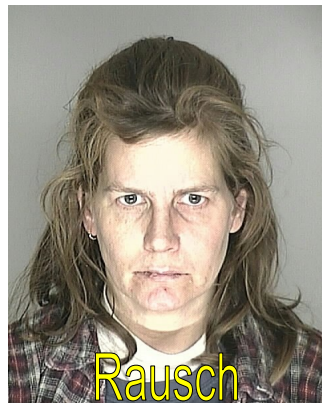
