

Won't Go Easy

On Wednesday, September 28th, Sergeant Eric Sammon and Officers Matt Shuda, Jeff Burbank and John Pesta were assisting RCSO Deputy Tim Schmidtke executing a court ordered eviction. A subject in the residence, Kevin Savoie, Jr., 37, was explained the eviction order and asked several times to leave peacefully. Savoie, who had his fists clenched, pushed Dep.

Schmidtke. He was quickly restrained and placed under arrest by the officers. As he was being escorted out of the residence, he attempted to head-butt Sgt. Sammon. Savoie was jailed without further incident. He was charged with Obstruction of Legal Process with Force, and his bail was set at \$3,000 with conditions.



On Wednesday, September 28th, agents of the Cannon River Drug and Violent Offender Task Force executed a search warrant at a Faribault residence. The agents were assisted by Sergeant Brandon Gliem, Detectives Scott Duncan and Brittany Carstensen, RCSO Deputy Steve Bauer and Officers John Pesta, Matt Shuda and Sergeant Eric Sammon. The agents found one of the resi-

dents, Todd Wenner, 41, in possession of methamphetamine residue. He was arrested and jailed without incident. He was charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances, and his bail was set at \$2,000 with conditions. The residence involved has been detrimental to the neighborhood, and agents will continue to address drug activity taking place.
