The mini dogs are available at the Faribault Police Department and Affinity Plus Credit Union. Additional locations will be announced next week.

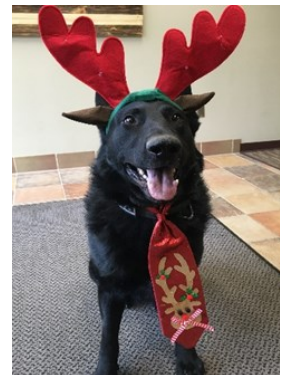

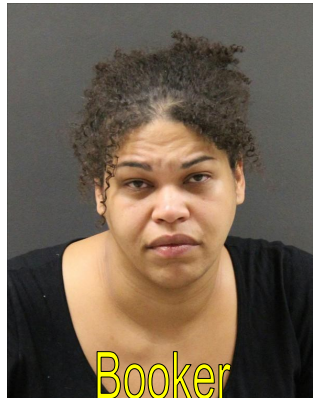

Narcotics Arrest

On Tuesday, November 29th, agents of the **Cannon River Drug and Violent Offender Task Force** arrested Deshaundra Booker, 29, of Owatonna as a result of an investigation into methamphetamine sales. During the investigation, Booker was observed to sell over 24 grams of methamphetamine during several recorded sales to an undercover agent. Booker was jailed and



charged with 1st degree Controlled Substances, and her bail was set at \$25,000 with conditions.

On Wednesday, November 30th, **CSO Michael Shuda** gave a presentation to preschool students at MSAD. He spoke about police officers and showed them a police car and the tools on his belt.



Suspicious Male Arrested

On Tuesday, November 29th, **Officers Mike Thul, Karl Willers and Ben Johns** responded to a reported suspicious person. Several callers reported a male had entered, or tried to enter, their residences. The frightened residents reported the male acted erratically, claimed he had been assaulted, and then ran to other homes. The officers located the suspect, Jeffrey Smith, 38, in the backyard of one residence,

and he had to be ordered multiple times to stop before he eventually complied. Smith claimed he had been assaulted and thrown into a lake, but could not explain his erratic behavior or failure to ask for help. Smith was cited with 4th degree Criminal Damage to Property, Disorderly Conduct and trespassing. He was later released on his own recognition by the court.



Bad Place to Sleep

On Monday, November 28th, **Officer Todd Hanson** stopped to check on two people sleeping in a vehicle. **Officer Adam Marvin** checked the vehicle registration and, through some research, determined the owner was a non-compliant predatory offender and was using a different name. Ofc. Marvin met with the suspect, James Reed, 38, who admitted he had changed his



name and was not current with his registration. Inside the vehicle, Ofc. Marvin observed a methamphetamine pipe. Reed was arrested and jailed without incident. He was charged with Predatory Offender Violation and 5th degree Controlled Substances. His bail was set at \$2,000 with conditions.
